How to Use this Directory

elcome to the revised edition of the *Directory of Services* for *Children*. Here, you will find a comprehensive listing of agencies serving children, parents and families in Jamaica. The Directory includes both national organisations that operate across the country and local organisations that operate at the parish or regional level. It covers nine types of organisations:

- Advocacy, Research and Educational Services
- Care and Protection
- Children with Disabilities and Exceptional Abilities
- Counselling and Psychological Intervention
- Financial Assistance
- Health Services
- Recreation and Culture
- Skills Training and Career Development; and
- Youth Organisations

The Directory is organised into three main sections: the general listing – Child Services – contains an alphabetical list of all the services. All organisations are included in this listing in alphabetical order. This is followed by two separate listings: Libraries and Hospitals. These two lists are organised by parish, in alphabetical order. To find an organisation, you may flip through the three sections, or simply look it up in the indexes that begin on page 198. The first index – Child Services Index – lists all the Child Services organisations in alphabetical order. The second index – Index by Parish – lists all organisations that exist in each parish. The third – Index by Type of Service – lists all the organisations by the type of service they offer.

Throughout, you will find parenting and reading tips that will help you to encourage and nurture the children you care for and work with.

Il parents in Jamaica — whether by virtue of having given birth, adopting or serving as guardians — recognise, accept and discharge their duty to ensure that the rights of children are always upheld, the best interests of children are always

promoted and their children are always loved and provided with opportunities and resources to achieve their full potential and ultimate fulfillment, within safe, caring and nurturing environments.

A Short Summary of the Parent Charter Jamaican Parent(s) will:

- Plan for parenthood and make parenting a priority in their lives.
- Strive to achieve a positive relationship and partnership so that both mother and father play an active role in the child(ren)'s life.
- Give consistent love and affection to their child(ren) and praise and encouragement for their efforts.
- Provide a safe, healthy and nurturing home environment, free from any form of abuse.
- Deal constructively with behaviour and seek help and advice as needed.
- Ensure the child(ren) are protected from emotional, physical or sexual abuse and exploitation.
- Ensure the child(ren) are adequately supervised and properly cared for at all times.
- Maintain a healthy lifestyle for themselves (especially for mothers who should begin in early pregnancy), so as to serve as models for their children
- Spend quality time with their child(ren).
- Encourage the child(ren) to participate in family decisions, activities and community life.
- Prepare the child(ren) to begin formal schooling emergent literate/ numerate by reading, talking and playing with their children often; this supports their mental and emotional readiness for formal school.
- Ensure that if they have to leave their child(ren) in the care of a relative
 or friend or a prolonged period the child's school is informed in order to
 ensure guardianship responsibilities are fulfilled.
- Become active partners in their child(ren)'s education by encouraging and supporting opportunities for them to learn and grow into critically thinking, creative, productive, socially aware, tolerant adults.
- Continue to support a strong home-school connection and ensure parallel reinforcement of lessons learned.
- Attend PTA meetings at least once per year and actively participate in school activities including parent-teacher conferences at least once/term.

n 1989, world leaders decided that children needed a special convention just for them because people under 18 years old often need special care and protection that adults do not. The leaders also wanted to make sure that the world recognised that children have human rights too. The Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) is the first legally binding international instrument to incorporate the full range of human rights — including civil, cultural, economic, political and social rights.

The Convention has achieved near-universal acceptance, having now been ratified by 193 parties – more than belong to the United Nations or have acceded to the Geneva Conventions.

The provisions and principles of the CRC guide UNICEF in its mission of advocating for the protection of children's rights, helping children to meet their basic needs and expanding their opportunities to reach their full potential.

The Convention sets out these rights in 54 articles and two Optional Protocols. It spells out the basic human rights that children everywhere have: the right to survival; to develop to the fullest; to protection from harmful influences, abuse and exploitation; and to participate fully in family, cultural and social life. The four core principles of the Convention are non-discrimination; devotion to the best interests of the child; the right to life, survival and development; and respect for the views of the child.

Every right spelled out in the CRC is inherent to the human dignity and harmonious development of every child. The Convention protects children's rights by setting standards in health care; education; and legal, civil and social services.

By agreeing to undertake the obligations of the CRC (by ratifying or acceding to it), national governments have committed themselves to protecting and ensuring children's rights – and they have agreed to hold themselves accountable for this commitment before the international community. States parties to the Convention are obliged to develop and undertake all actions and policies in the light of the best interests of the child.

Jamaica ratified the CRC in May 1991.

QUICK REFERENCE: CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD (CRC)

Who is a Child?

Article 1: A child is a person under the age of 18 years.

Freedom from Discrimination

Article 2: All the rights in this Convention belong to all children.

Best Interest of the Child

Article 3: Children must always be a top priority.

Implementation of Rights

Article 4: Governments must do all they can to protect children's rights.

Parental Guidance and the Child's Development

Article 5: Parents/families should guide children and help them to understand their rights.

Survival and Development

Article 6: Every child has the right to be alive and to be the best person they can be.

Name and Nationality

Article 7: Every child has the right to a name and nationality and to be cared for by both parents.

Preservation of Identity

Article 8: Governments must protect the child's right to a name, nationality and family life.

Separation from Parents

Article 9: Every child has the right to keep in regular contact with both parents.

Family Reunification

Article 10: Decisions about a child living in another country should be made quickly and fairly.

Illicit Transfer and Non-Return

Article 11: Governments must work together to stop children being taken illegally to another country.

The Child's Opinion

Article 12: Children have the right to express their views and these views must be taken seriously.

Freedom of Expression

Article 13: Children have the right to express themselves and to receive all kinds of information and ideas.

Freedom of Thought, Conscience and Religion

Article 14: Children have the right to have their own beliefs and religion.

Freedom of Association

Article 15: Every child has the right to meet together and to join or set up groups, as long as it is not harmful to others.

Protection of Privacy

Article 16: The laws must protect every child's right to privacy.

Access to Appropriate Information

Article 17: Governments must make sure children get information that is important for their wellbeing from various sources. Adults should protect children from harmful information.

Parental Responsibilities

Article 18: Governments must support parents. Parents must always try to do what is best for children.

Protection from Abuse and Neglect

Article 19: Every child must be protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect and mistreatment.

Protection of a Child without Family

Article 20: Children who do not live with their parents have the right to extra protection.

Adoption

Article 21: Relevant authorities must uphold the best interest of children who are adopted.

Refugee Children

Article 22: Children who are refugees, or trying to be refugees, have the right to extra protection.

Aims of Education

Article 29: Education is about children developing as fully as possible.

Children of Minorities or Indigenous Populations

Article 30: Children must never be stopped from enjoying their own culture, religion or language.

Leisure, Recreation and Cultural Activities

Article 31: Every child has the right to rest, play and do things they enjoy.

Child Labour

Article 32: Children must be protected from harmful work.

Drug Abuse

Article 33: Governments must do everything to protect children from illegal drugs.

Sexual Exploitation

Article 34: Governments must protect children from being hurt sexually.

Sale, Trafficking and Abduction

Article 35: Governments must do everything to protect children from being taken away or sold.

Other Forms of Exploitation

Article 36: Governments must protect children from all other harm.

Torture and Deprivation of Liberty

Article 37: No child should be tortured or treated cruelly. Detention/imprisonment of children should be a last resort. Children should not imprisoned with adults.

Armed Conflicts

Article 38: Children must be protected from wars and from joining the armed forces.

Rehabilitative Care

Article 39: Governments must give good support to children who have been abused or harmed.

Administration of Juvenile Justice

Article 40: Children who are in trouble with the law have many additional rights, including the right to privacy, legal assistance, guidance and counselling, education, vocational training, and wherever possible, the right not to go to court or to be sent to prison.

Enforcing the CRC

Articles 41 and 43-54: These articles say how children's rights should be monitored and enforced, including the establishment of a Committee on the Rights of the Child which considers national reports on implementation of the Convention, submitted two years after ratification and every five years thereafter.

Information on the CRC

Article 42: Governments must inform everybody about all rights in the Convention.







THE CHILD CARE & PROTECTION ACT

'Act Right – Love, Honour and Protect Our Children'

What is the Child Care and Protection Act?

The landmark Child Care and Protection Act (CCPA) was signed into law on March 25, 2004. The Act makes rules about the care and protection of every Jamaican child. The law applies to parents, teachers, day-care centre workers, doctors, nurses, guidance counselors and other persons who work with children. In fact, EVERY ADULT HAS A RESPONSIBILITY under the law.

What are the main purposes of this Act?

- To make sure that adults consider the views and best interests of children.
- To put in place organisations- like the Children's Registry and the Office of the Children's Advocate to monitor the care and protection of children.
- To provide special help to children who are in need of care and protection.
- To make sure that all children are protected from abuse or neglect.

What does the Act say about the duties of a parent?

The Act says that parents have the main responsibility for the care and protection of children. Parental duties apply to:

- Both mother and father, whether or not they live with the child.
- Step-parents, foster parents or adoptive parents.
- Guardians or other persons charged with the raising of the child.

Some of these duties are:

- To provide children with food, clothing, shelter and healthcare (e.g. immunization).
- To provide education by ensuring that all children between the ages of 4 and 16 are registered and attending school.
- To provide maintenance or financial support for children.
- To protect children from abuse, neglect and harm.

HOW DO I KNOW WHEN A CHILD IS IN NEED OF CARE AND PROTECTION?

The Act gives some examples which include:

- The child who has no parent or guardian.
- The child who is exposed to moral danger or bad company.
- The child whose physical or mental health is in danger.
- The child who is destitute or living in extreme poverty.
- The child who is living, wandering or begging on the streets.







Every adult has one main duty under the Act: To make a report if they know or suspect that a child is being abused or is in need of care and protection. This duty to report applies:

- Whether you are certain or only suspicious.
- Whether the abuse has happened, is happening or is likely to happen.

The Act also lists some things that adults must NOT do with children:

- Do NOT sell or give drugs, cigarettes or alcohol (e.g. beer or rum) to a child.
- Do NOT allow a child to work or go into a nightclub.
- Do NOT employ a child younger than 15 years old, unless the work does not affect the child's health or education. Children under 13 should not be employed at all.
- Do NOT use a child to do anything immoral or illegal.

Violations and penalties under the Act

The Act identifies violations against children and prescribes penalties for offences. Offences against children include:

- Physical abuse, ill treatment and emotional abuse
- Sexual/carnal abuse
- Child labour
- Offences against the person such as aggravated assault and murder
- Failure to report suspected abuse
- Administrative offences (unauthorized disclosure of reports)
- Violation of terms of licence of children's homes and other in situations.

Significant penalties are imposed for failure to report suspected cases of abuse, neglect or abandonment of children. For the first time, offences such as the trafficking of children are enshrined in the law. The Act also makes it mandatory for any person who suspects that a child is being abused to report it to the appropriate authorities, or face stiff penalties. The court is mandated to refer a case in which a child victim is in need of legal representation to the Children's Advocate or grant a Legal Aid Certificate.

Cruelty and Neglect: Cruelty to children attracts a \$1 million dollar fine or 12 months in prison. Neglecting your child can result in maximum sentence of three years. Parents who harm their children may be prevented from living with their children. If you leave your child at home alone and they get injured you could be imprisoned for up to three years for neglect, or face more serious charges such as manslaughter. Other types of abuse will attract higher sentences, based on the level of harm done to the child.

Serious Offences (Carnal Abuse and Murder): The maximum sentence for incest (having sex with your daughter, granddaughter or similar relative) has been









increased to 16 years imprisonment. Serious offences against children attract penalties similar to those under the offences Against the Person Act Including Capital and Non Capital punishment.

Child Labour: The penalty for employing children contrary to the Act, attract fines of up to \$500,000 or six months imprisonment at hard labour. Hiring a child to work in a night club attracts a penalty of \$1,000,000.00 and the risk of having the club closed by the authorities.

Mandatory Reporting: The maximum penalty for not making a report regarding suspected case of abuse or neglect is \$500,000, or 6 months imprisonment. The report must be made without delay. The person making the report cannot be sued. Knowingly making a false report attracts a maximum penalty of \$250,000 or three months imprisonment.

Operating Private and Government Homes: Violating the terms of a private children's home licence attracts a maximum fine of \$500,000or six months imprisonment or both. The penalty for not allowing inspections of a private facility is a fine of \$250,000 or three months imprisonment in default of payment.

Publishing the Identity of a Child: It is an offence to publish a report of any Children's court proceedings which reveals details such as name, address, school or picture leading to the identification of a child who is a victim, the subject of dispute before the court, a witness or the accused, unless the Court orders that this may be done. Violation of this provision attracts a maximum penalty of \$1 million or 12 months imprisonment.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

Every Member of Society has a Responsibility

A West African retention, Jamaica has always had a strong tradition of the community and extended family playing an integral role in child rearing.

The CCPA has embraced the concept of the 'Village Raising the Child' as one of its key principles, by making it incumbent on every member of society to protect children. The Act emphasizes that the duty to protect children, not only rests with the family, but is a shared responsibility of all members of society.

The Act outlines the specific role and function of key players in society in protecting and caring for children such as:

- The Family
- Fit Persons
- Government Officials
- The Police

- The Court
- The Media
- The Children's Registry
- The Justices of the Peace
- The Children's Advocate
- · Private Children's Homes
- Children's Officers
- Places of Safety
- Probation and After Care Officers
- Prescribed Persons

The role and function of key groups in the care and protection of children under the Act

FAMILY (Biological, step and adoptive parents, other relatives and guardians) The family has a duty to:

- Provide care the basic survival needs such as food, clothing and shelter.
- Provide an education.
- Prevent abuses in all forms (physical, sexual, emotional).
- Report suspected cases of abuse against children.
- Prevent child labour.
- Seek assistance from the State if needed.

FIT PERSON

(A person in whose care a child is entrusted by the Court)

A Fit Person Order is granted by the Court in relation to a child in need of care and protection. The role of the Fit Person is similar to that of a child's parent or guardian in respect of maintenance.

The community and general public members of the community have a duty to:

- Prevent abuse.
- Report suspected cases of abuse.
- Prevent child labour.

THE POLICE

The police play a key role as it related to both children in need of care and protection and children in conflict with the law. It is the duty of the police to:

- Receive complaints.
- Investigate allegations of abuse against children.
- Make arrests if necessary.
- Make referrals to support services.
- Ensure that a child is brought before the court within 48 hours of being taken to a place of safety.
- Participate in court cases.

CHILDREN'S OFFICER, PROBATION AND AFTER-CARE OFFICER

These officer's among other things:

- Initiate the process of having a warrant issued by a JP to search for a child in need of care and protection
- Take a child in need of care and protection to a place of safety and carry out the necessary follow-up.

THE MEDIA

The media have a special responsibility to:

Protect the privacy of children who are involve in Court proceedings as either a victim, witness or accused, by not revealing details such as name, address, school or photo leading to the identification of the child.

THE CHILDREN'S REGISTRY

Receives information on suspected cases of children in danger of being abandoned, neglected, physically and sexually ill-treated or who are otherwise in need of care and protection.

THE CHILDREN'S ADVOCATE

- Represents children in court.
- Brings non criminal court proceedings concerning the rights or the best interest of children.
- Reviews the laws relating to child rights as well as services provided for children provided by relevant authorities.
- Receives and conducts investigations into complaints made by or on behalf of a child whose rights have been infringed including those who are inmates and detainees of government institutions.
- Provides financial assistance to children making complaints and maintains proper records of the complaints received without revealing details of the child involved.
- Gives advice and makes recommendations to Parliament, ministers and the relevant authorities relating to the rights and the best interest of the child.

OPERATORS OF PRIVATE & GOVERNMENT LICENSED CHILDREN'S HOMESOperators must:

- Comply with the terms and conditions of the three year licence to operate the home including allowing for inspections by the relevant authorities.
- Act in the best interest of every child in the home including ensuring that they are treated humanely, receive suitable health care, education, and all their rights are protected.
- Provide the Minister with written notification of every child received into the home within 48 hours, seven days notice of his/her removal and other relevant updates as required by the Act.







Administrators and staff of places of safety are required to:

- Ensure that a child brought to a Place of Safety is taken before the Court.
- Recognize, respect, protect and ensure the rights that the Act guarantees to children in care.
- Forward to the Children's Advocate any complaint made by any child.

GOVERNMENT AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE FOR CHILDREN

These agencies among other functions, have a duty to:

- Investigate reports referred by the Children's Registry, and if necessary arrange for the child in question to be brought before a court as a child in need of care and protection.
- Receive contributions paid towards the maintenance of a child in care of a Fit Person and apply for money for the benefit of the child.


